

Scope of work

Client: Maritime Safety Queensland (MSQ)

July 2021

North Marine's commercial dive department is contracted to salvage the wreck of the SV Roma from Dixon Inlet, Port Douglas, QLD.

North Marine crew and divers inspect the wreckage and over two days, work to eliminate further environmental risk and prepare the vessel for salvage. 300L of oil & diesel and 11 lead-acid batteries are removed. With additional SOPEP, North Marine divers detach the anchoring system & manoeuvre to an approved site where vessel is careened on the bank at king tide. A demolition crew is engaged for its safe disposal. The salvage was completed with a thorough site assessment & clean of the area. NM workboat 'Tin Duck' was used.
