



SALVAGE OF 'OCEAN RAMBLER' CAPE BEDFORD

► Scope of work

Client: Maritime Safety Queensland (MSQ)

2026

In January 2026, North Marine was engaged by MSQ to remove and dispose of the derelict vessel Ocean Rambler from a remote, environmentally sensitive location south of Cape Bedford.

Due to limited site access, tidal constraints and the vessel's deteriorated condition, the operation required careful planning and site setup to enable safe works. North Marine mobilised 'Pacific Ranger' and barge 'Lucy', completed pre-works inspections and site preparation and undertook controlled demolition using an excavator, with all materials loaded directly onto the barge. The site was cleaned and screened on completion, with all works delivered in accordance with MSQ requirements and relevant biosecurity controls.

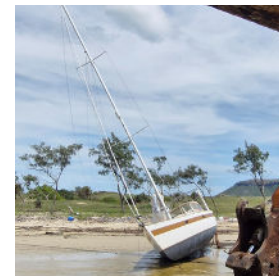
